Letter to Parents & Friends of Schutz dated Sept. 9, 1979 from George Meloy
One week down and 35 weeks (or is it 36?) to go! And believe us when we say that it is 36 weeks (or 35) of getting to live with and help several dozen boarders and several score of day students become better people over the year ahead of us. All has started well. ... We are almost ready to begin life as usual around here. The boys' floor was relatively easy to get set up on the top floor of the classroom building -- beds for 18 boys in six rooms. Students and staff have used them for boarding before. All seem comfortable and satisfied. The girls' floor-and-a-half was a different matter. We were sure that a complete bathroom renovation would be finished before anyone arrived. We were merely nine days off in our calculations but I think everyone feels that the inconvenience was worthwhile. Extra toilets, sinks and showers will give the girls more space in which to become more beautiful and better smelling. Their water is solar heated - the first such device in Egypt. We haven't mentioned to them that cloudy days may mean cooler water. But they now will blame God instead of the butagaz man! ... Events of the past week -- tour of Alexandria, picnic lunch on the beach, softball game with the marines and friends, studying already - Happy Birthday to Hussein Amery and Adi Husseini.... Total enrollment at Fairhaven 70 and at Schutz 96 = 166 28 different nationalities represented
