pray for the work here. Early in Aug. the city of Juba was in  
an uproar. 50,000 head of cattle were driven by Mundari  
tribesmen into the city, filling most vacant lots. The Sudan  
Peoples Liberation Army apparently was in hot pursuit. This  
began about 3 weeks of tension with the airport closed,  
followed by all roads in and out of Juba closed. ACROSS  
Sudanese staff along with 3 others were shot while running an  
army road block; two American Catholic sisters were captured  
a few miles out of town & held 5 days; the city of Juba  
became an armed camp as fighting took place to the north of  
the city; a Sudan Airways plane was shot down near Malakal,  
killing 60 passengers & crew, and many people began  
considering ways to evacuate. Population of Juba has swelled  
from an estimated 90,000 to about 120,000. People fleeing &  
fighting arriving with no food or shelter. Several tented  
camps were set up around the city to house the displaced.  
ACROSS & others began providing assistance. At least 60 tons  
of grain are needed each week just to keep the population of  
Juba alive. Most gardens were destroyed by the cattle  
driven into town. An estimated 2 million people are facing  
starvation in South Sudan right now. What should our  
response be? Though we were advised to leave Sudan, we have  
felt that we should not at this time. With the great need  
around us we have become aware of the many opportunities to  
show the love of Jesus Christ. Juba, like Ninevah, is a  
city of 120,000 with many cattle. Juba, like Ninevah, is in  
need of knowing the love, mercy and forgiveness of God. Pray  
that the Church may see the opportunities God is giving.
